Conference 4.0

Industry 4.0 is the summation of principles developed by German manufacturers in 2011. The foundation of Industry 4.0 is that by connecting machines, work pieces and systems, businesses are creating intelligent networks along the entire value chain that can control each other autonomously and save time and money.

While it has direct implications for activity related to manufacturing, and we will consider some such implications, it may not apply directly to all commercially related activity. But this conference goes beyond manufacturing. The basic legal principles codified by an Eastern Roman emperor in 565 and the basic accounting principles codified by an Italian monk in 1494, still guide us. But we adopt the basic approach of Industry 4.0 – technical connectivity - to become smarter in business.

We consider how we can use IA-CEPA (the Indonesia-Australia Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement) and the principles of communication and cooperation on which that is based to improve our world.

We begin with a general look across the board at the economic and political forces shaping our future and discuss how they are looking.

In the context of this Conference, we emphasis our continuing wish to work with, not simply in, Indonesia. We fully support President Jokowi's desire to be 'sovereign, self-reliant and distinctive' (reflecting President Sukarno's Trisakti). We also recognize that self-reliance does not resist but needs, capital and foreign investment.
